

# FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE CHART

Chart	Description	Key Points
<b>Metaphor and Simile Chart</b>	Distinguishes between metaphors and similes with definitions and examples.	Defines metaphors and similes, provides clear examples, and helps correct usage in writing.
<b>Types of Figurative Language Chart</b>	Covers various figurative language techniques with brief definitions and examples.	Includes metaphors, similes, personification, hyperbole, and idioms.
<b>Personification Chart</b>	Explains personification and gives examples of human qualities attributed to non-human things.	Defines personification, provides examples, and encourages students to create their own examples.
<b>Hyperbole Chart</b>	Defines hyperbole and shows its usage with examples.	Deliberate exaggeration for emphasis, lists common examples, and helps students identify hyperbole.
<b>Idioms Chart</b>	Defines idioms and provides common examples with meanings.	Explains idioms, lists common idiomatic expressions, and encourages recognition in writing and speech.
<b>Onomatopoeia Chart</b>	Illustrates onomatopoeia with examples of words that imitate sounds.	Defines onomatopoeia, lists examples (e.g., buzz, clang), and helps use it in writing.
<b>Alliteration and Assonance Chart</b>	Explains alliteration (repetition of consonant sounds) and assonance (vowel sounds) with examples.	Defines both techniques, provides examples, and helps students use sound devices in writing.
