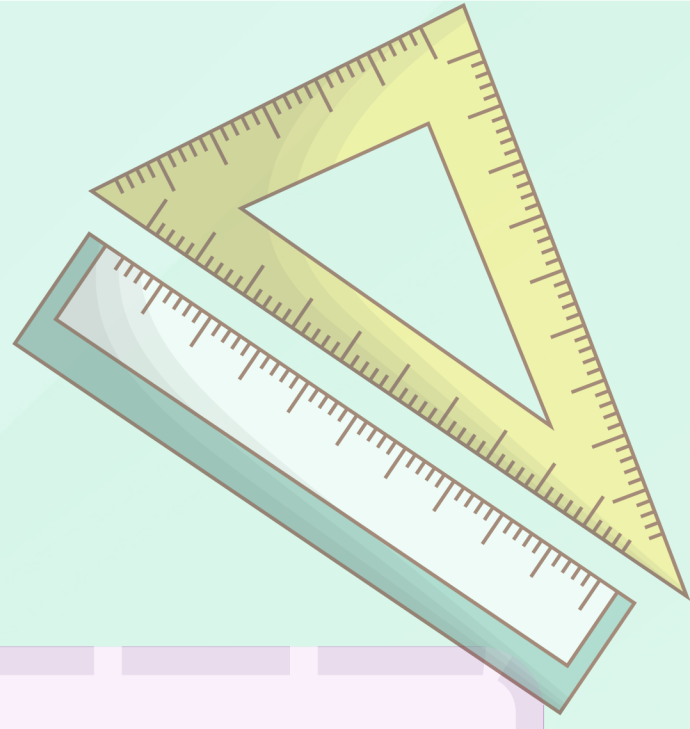




# Elementary School Prompts

6. Describe an object that holds important memories for a character.

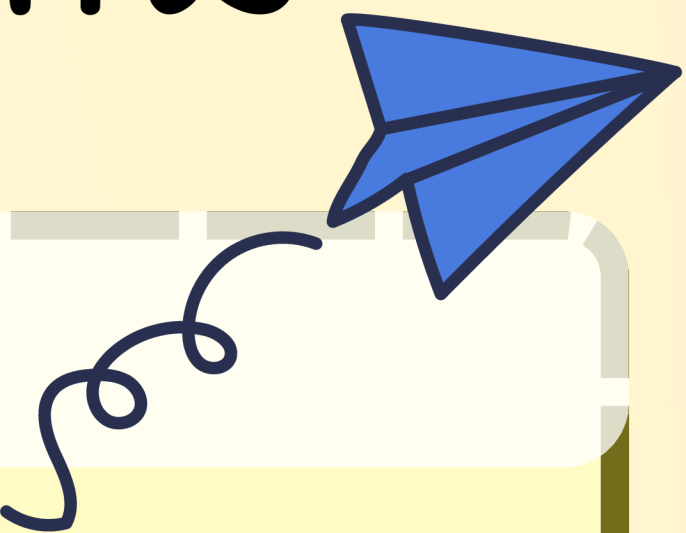
7. Write a story where a character finds a map with only one clue on it.

8. Describe a goal you want to reach this month and what steps you can take.

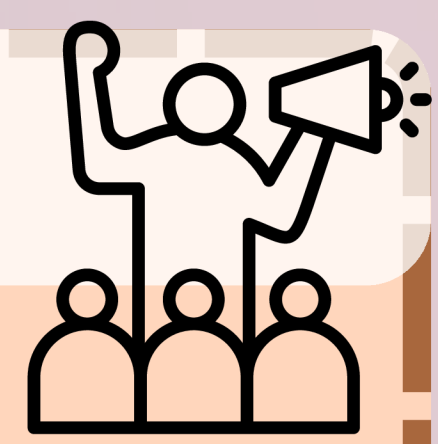
9. Write about a moment that taught you something important about kindness.

**17. Should schools require uniforms? Share your perspective.**

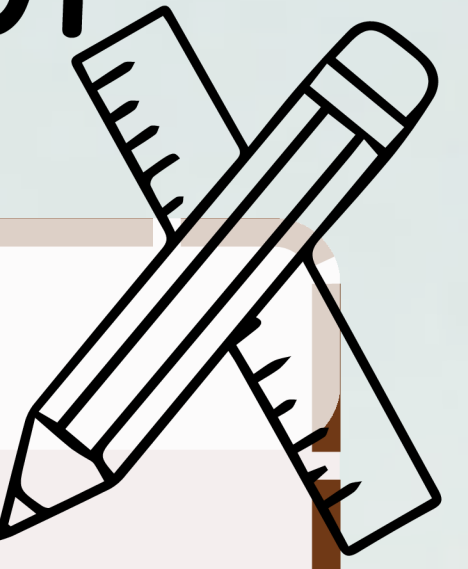
**18. Should extra credit be offered in every subject? Explain your thinking.**
